| Home Visiting | Intensive parenting education program shown to effectively reduce child abuse and improve child health outcomes |
|---------------|---|
| Childcare | Subsidizes the cost of child care for families with incomes at or below 200 percent of the federal poverty line |
| CYFD PreK | Early education program for 3 and 4 year olds available for half-day services |
| PED PreK | Early education program for 3 and 4 year olds available for extended day services |

Work Force

According to the 2018 New Mexico Educator Vacancy Report, which focuses on teacher licensure and does not include data on associates degrees, in the 2017-2018 school year:

- 63 people completed educator preparation programs in early childhood, and
- 102 students were admitted into programs

The following information was reported for Total Education Vacancies:


