

## OUR WORK: MEASURABLE IMPACT

#### **Growing Up NM Home Visiting**

Provides support for parents with young children, prenatally through age five. Weekly visits offer tools, guidance, and resources that promote confident, healthy, and happy families.

#### **Measurable Impact**

- 5,654 visits to 410 families
- 100% of moms received prenatal care
- 699 referrals to outside agencies

#### **Family, Friends & Neighbors**

Supports home-base child care providers by increasing knowledge of child development and early learning, thereby resulting in increased social, emotional, and academic outcomes for children being cared for in home-based settings.

#### **Measurable Impact**

- 42 caregivers enrolled
- 100 children received care
- Launched online book club and Es Hoy y Ahora provider wellness program

#### **Bridges to Opportunity**

Launched early 2021, provides navigation to address immediate needs like emergency aid, food, transportation, housing insecurity, and child care, as well as coaching to aid in setting and reaching self-identified goals.

#### **Measurable Impact**

- 44 families served
- 77 children served
- 109 referrals to outside agencies

#### **Great Start Family Support**

Provides three home visits over the first month of a new baby's life. Trained professionals support parents with feeding, infant development, postpartum recovery, as well as provide connections to community resources.

#### **Measurable Impact**

- 501 visits
- 219 families completed the program
- 71% breastfeeding at last visit

#### Early Learning Programs at Kaune

NAEYC accredited PreK and child care programming for three- and four-yearold children and their families. Draws on innovation and research to prepare students for success in kindergarten and far beyond.

#### **Measurable Impact**

- 110 families enrolled for centerbased early education, developing language, literacy, and socialemotional skills
- Children, on average, made a little over one year's growth in literacy, and almost a year-and-ahalf growth in mathematics.

#### **Dolly Parton's Imagination Library**

Promotes early literacy and increased reading frequency among young children, families, and care takers. Books are delivered every month to enrolled children until age five.

#### **Measurable Impact**

- **26,373** books were sent to children in Santa Fe County
- **439** families received additional Spanish language books

#### We're closing the achievement gap for children 0-5 during their biggest developmental years.

Research shows that a child's cognitive, social, and emotional development during the first years of life is essential to future learning. Since 85% of brain development occurs by age five, positive early experiences and family stability are critical to future outcomes like academic success, employment, physical health, and mental well-being.

We are demonstrating the powerful link between children and families who thrive and the prosperity of their communities, by delivering a combination of research, high-quality programming, and smart public policy.

## We lead with creative family-centered and multi-generational programs.

Guiding principles drive our work, including the belief that **all children and families are capable and deserving of success.** 

We use a Multi-Generational Approach to create opportunities for, and address the unique needs of, children and caregivers to move the entire family unit toward educational success, economic security, health, and well-being.



## A YEAR IN REVIEW

2021 was one the most dynamic years in our organizational history. We changed our name and maintained operations through a global health and economic pandemic. Throughout the year, we prioritized getting resources to families and adapting our programs to be as effective as possible in changing conditions.

We are incredibly proud of how the staff, Board, and community surrounding Growing Up New Mexico adapted and made incredible progress during this unpredictable time. A few of our accomplishments include: offering our home visiting program either in-person or online in order to meet the needs of families; expanding outdoor learning and maintaining safe, high-quality care; launching the innovative Bridges to Opportunity program; completing the state's 3-year New Mexico Early Childhood Strategic Plan; and growing our presence in national early childhood conversations and philanthropic circles.

Of course, COVID-19 dramatically reshaped the early childhood landscape. Families struggling prior to the crisis were disproportionately affected by the pandemic. Supporting these families has become more urgent while finding professionals to work in the community has become more difficult. But the importance of child care and family support is better understood and more widely held than ever before, and Growing Up New Mexico is committed to unlocking every opportunity as we emerge and recover from the pandemic.

## LOOKING AHEAD

As we move into 2022, Growing Up New Mexico will continue to center the voices of early childhood stakeholders and to engage our diverse community to build a stronger early childhood system.

We will build upon our progress to continue to innovate and test creative, real-world solutions. This will include supporting home-based caregivers as central to transforming child care, connecting families to these caregivers and other resources consistent with our multi-generational approach, and identifying administrative and policy improvements which will remove barriers and increase access to high-quality programs throughout New Mexico communities.

Expanding partnerships will also be a priority in the coming year. We will continue to push for collaboration and complementary efforts with other organizations. This includes working to incorporate behavioral and mental health resources at the Early Learning Center at Kaune through an Infant Mental Health Consultation Model, based on the needs of our families and educators. It also includes building a coalition of support for actionable solutions to increase the pay, benefits, and support for early childhood professionals.

Our goals and ideas are big, and it will take every resource we can weave together to make the most progress and the greatest impact. We are ready to pursue the incredible opportunities ahead. We look forward to updating you next year.
